

I do have the conviction, that regardless of our successes and failures in life, the only thing that will remain and be eternal, is the ways in which we grow to know our God as a person. We are in a unique time in history, able to live by the New Covenant through the re-creation of the Holy Spirit dwelling in us. We can know Him personally in a way that no one could before the resurrection, and when He returns, it will be the end of people knowing Him in these ways. For us, it is when we physically die that there will be no more opportunities, normally through

sufferings and failures. We could perhaps still experience a little through remembering our physical lives, but I think those memories will dissipate quickly in our new lives in Heaven. Those of us who truly know His love, forgiveness, patience, kindness through our physical lives will be a unique tribe in Heaven.

1 Thessalonians 5:19 ¹⁹ *Do not quench the Spirit.*

If we can not live a perfect live with out sin, why the apostle Paul say that . Thank you

Well, I would encourage you to live a perfect life, without sin, if that's what you think it means. If you fail, then of course God will be deeply ashamed to have known you, you will be completely rejected by Him until you succeed, and if you die before you do, you will of course go to Hell. So, do it, and get back with me when you feel you have succeeded.

I personally think the answer to your question is going to be found by understanding that what you described is not the only way to interpret what Paul was intending to say by quenching the Spirit. If you learn more about the role of the Holy Spirit of God in your life, I think you will see how an interpretation like this, is the very act of quenching the Spirit.

I first discovered huge work on a Christian radio station in Dallas; KAAM which has since gone off the air. I really appreciate your online library and have been listening to the verse by verse on the Gospel of John. It's truly been a Blessing, especially since I am still a relatively new believer. I do plan on making future donations as I think your work is extremely valuable. I did try to direct one of my cousins to the programs on how to bring up the topic to a Jewish person.

I have most recently been trying to direct a friend of mine who is extremely Jewish, she just told me today not to bother because she has been studying the Torah, celebrates all the holidays, and is extremely dedicated to her faith. I tried to explain the Jewishness of Yeshua, the earliest believers and Church but to no avail. Wondered if you had any advice, in addition to the series?

Thank you for letting me know, and yes, the Gospel of John recordings were supported through donations by people who wanted you to listen to them. Any donations you are able to make will go towards radio broadcasting, and the development of the programs through First and Second Corinthians.

The programs on telling Jews about Jesus will give you most of what I know when it comes to reaching out to religious Jews, but I can add something from my conversations with Rabbis. It was several years after I discovered who the Messiah is, that they continued to try and save me from believing in Jesus. The last serious conversation was with a couple of Rabbis who flew out from New York, to where I was in Boise, ID at the time. It ended with a discussion of the nature of the real problem. I presented the issue that through the decision of Adam and Eve, we are born into this world spiritually dead, and this problem needs to be resolved. Their position was that if a person is born Jewish, they are born spiritually alive, and all others are not. I expressed that a universal problem needs more of a universal solution in my opinion, but that was

the end of the discussion. Reflecting on that over the years, I do feel comfortable with just leaving it to that end. We can speak of prophecy, and the solution to spiritual death, and the answer to the question of do we live by the knowledge of good and evil or not. After that, it is time to move on to the next person in my opinion, unless the Lord encourages otherwise in a unique relationship.

[Question about joy from Colorado Springs, CO]

When the scripture says, "the joy of the Lord shall be my strength" The question that I can't seem to settle is this, is it His joy? Or is it my joy that I have about Him?

Yes, grammatically it is written in what is called the construct state, to construct a possessiveness of the joy being the Lord's which is what we can make use of to be our strength. So yes, it is His joy that we can receive from Him, which becomes our strength. To experience this, you must understand the joy He has in you personally. The relationship you have with Him is a joy to Him, your discovery of who He is as a person, and your personal growth in the world He created. Through this, you will have a unique strength through the difficulties and challenges of life.
